Keynote Speaker: Professor Shannon Scott, Faculty of Nursing and Canada Research Chair in Knowledge Translation in Child Health at the University of Alberta in Edmonton, Canada. Professor Scott is currently appointed as a Visiting Full Professor (Children’s Nursing) at UCD School of Nursing, Midwifery and Health Systems.

Professor Scott’s research programme (ECHO – translating Evidence in Child Health to enhance Outcomes) aims to improve health outcomes for children in Canada through the application of the best research evidence. <http://www.echokt.ca/> Professor Scott is also co-Director of

Masterclass with Professor Maria Brenner is Professor in Children's Nursing and Head of Discipline for Children’s Nursing in the School of Nursing and Midwifery, TCD.

Professor Brenner’s research focus is on the care of children living with complex care needs and their families. She is the recipient of substantial national and international funding in this area, including EU Commission Horizon 2020 funding for the development of the 1st standards of care for children with complex care needs in Europe in Models of Child Health Appraised (MOCHA). She is currently Principal Investigator of *TechChild*, a €1.5m 5 year project with ERC funding exploring the initiation of technology dependence in children with complex care needs.

In this **Masterclass on Successful Grant Writing** Professor Brenner will draw on her experience to: examine the keywords used in funding calls; map out key points for inclusion in competitive funding applications; and examine funding panel expectations of the research team. ***Please note this Masterclass will be held during lunch.***
